Autumn Chicken and Veggie Sheet Pan

Ingredients:

- Bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs
- Olive oil
- Fresh herbs rosemary, thyme, sage
- Red wine vinegar
- Garlic
- Brussel sprouts
- Sweet potato
- Fuji apples
- Bacon
- Salt and pepper

instructions:

Drizzle 2 Tbsp of olive oil, season with salt and pepper then toss to coat. Spread into a pan in an even layer. Top with chicken pieces and sprinkle bacon over veggie/apple mixture. Roast in preheated oven until chicken has cooked through and veggies are tender, about 30-35 minutes, broil during last few minutes for more browned crispy chicken skin. Serve warm.
